



DEI

This committee planned and hosted a successful and exciting DEI GBM featuring two amazing panel members, one of them being the founder of BOW. This GBM focused on important topics such as the current state of DEI in the US followed by personal questions on the career experiences of both speakers. Additionally, the DEI committee hosted several pop-up events including Current State of DEI, Finance Diversity Panel, DEI x BSA event, and Diversity Programs in Consulting.

Social Impact
